Abstract of the Will of Henry Jeffery of Ebbesborne Wake in the County of Wiltshire, husbandman, written 3 Nov 1572, proved 11 Dec 1572.

Wills that his body be buried in the churchyard of Ebbesborne Wake.

Gives and bequeaths to **his son John Jeffery the'lder** an acre of wheat in tenement, his second largest brass pan, seven sheep to be kept in the close during the winter, and an acre of land in Biscomb.

Gives to **his son John Jeffery the younger** 6 shillings 8 pence, an acre of wheat at Dunlidge, his third largest pan, two platters, and one pottinger.

Gives and bequeaths to **his daughter Katherine** 20 shillings, an acre of wheat in tenement, an acre of barley, a calf when the red cow calves, two platters, one pottinger, one saucer, one candlestick, the brass pot with the broken lip, his smallest brass pan, one sheet, one blanket, one pillow, and other items.

Gives and bequeaths to **his daughter Johan** 26 shillings 8 pence, an acre of wheat in John Gryndon's land above Green Cliff Top, an acre of barley in Northfield, a calf from the black cow when she calves, two platters, one pottinger, a saucer, a candlestick, the short hangings and a cottrell with a bolt, all her mother's linen, her silver ring, her silver pin, and other items.

Gives to 3 shillings 4 pence to William Nightingale if he still lives with his son Harry at the time of the testator's death.

All the rest of his goods he gives to **his son Harry** whom he makes sole executor of his last will and testament.

Appoints Thomas Watts and John Goodfellow overseers of his last will and testament.
