

Prerogative Court of Canterbury Wills, PROB 11/941/57.

Abstract of the Will of Oliffe Richmond of Ashton Keynes in the County of Wilts, Gent., written 15 Nov 1725, proved 8 Jul 1768.

Gives & bequeaths to **his wife Joane Richmond** a moiety of all his household goods for the term of her natural life and after to **his son Oliffe Richmond**.

Gives & bequeaths to **his wife Joane Richmond** all his closes of arable land and pasture situated in South Cerney in Gloucester for the term of her natural life and after to **his son Oliffe Richmond**.

Gives, bequeaths & devises to **his father-in-law John Gallimore of Wootton Bassett, Gent.** and to **his brother-in-law Thomas Hulbert of Wootton Bassett, Gent.** all his freehold messuages, lands, tenements and hereditaments whatsoever.

Gives, bequeaths & devises £1,000 to **his daughter Joanne Richmond**.

Gives, bequeaths & devises £1,000 to **his daughter Jane Richmond**.

Gives £20 each to **his cousins Oliffe Henry Richmond and George Richmond, sons of his brother Henry Richmond**.

Gives one shilling to **his daughter Bridget Nicholas**, she having already been provided for.

Appoints **his son Oliffe Richmond** as sole executor of his last will and testament.

Administration (with Will) was granted to sisters Joanna Richmond and Jane Richmond, also administrators of the goods & chattels of Oliffe Richmond who died a bachelor and who was the sole executor and residuary legatee.
