Abstract of the Will of Mary Williams alias Carter of Farley in the County of Wilts, Widow, written 13 Oct 1730, proved 5 Feb 1733/4.

Gives and bequeaths 1 shilling to **her son-in-law William Whitmarsh** of Winterbourne, gunner.

Gives and bequeaths £5 to her granddaughter Elizabeth Whitmarsh, daughter of the said William Whitmarsh, to be paid to her when she reaches the age of twenty-one years. She also gives her granddaughter her least gold ring. If Elizabeth Whitmarsh should die before turning twenty-one, then she wills that the said £5 goes to her daughters Mary Adams and Lydia Williams als. Carter, share and share alike.

Gives and bequeaths £10 to **her daughter Lydia Williams** *als*. **Carter**, along with her second largest ring and all her household goods.

Gives and bequeaths 5 shillings to **her daughter Mary Adams** as well as her largest gold ring.

Gives and bequeaths 20 shillings to her granddaughter Mary Parsons.

Gives and bequeaths 20 shillings each to **her grandsons Thomas, Joseph and Daniel Williams**, to be paid to them at the age of twenty-one years.

Gives and bequeaths £2 to her granddaughter Sabina Williams.

Gives and bequeaths £25 to her son William, being the sum that she lent him.

Gives and bequeaths £20 to **her son John Williams** *als*. **Carter**, whom she appoints sole executor and residuary legatee of her last will and testament.
