Gives & bequeaths 30 shillings to the poor of Llanfihangel.

All the rest & residue he gives to **his wife Jane Brynkyr** whom he appoints Executrix of his last will and testament.

Nominates his cousins & kinsmen William Owen of Clen----- Esqr., Lewis Anwyll of Parke, Richard Anwyll of Parke, Owen Wynne of Yslym Begid? Esqr., and Richard Anwyll of Doleferiog gent. as overseers of his last will and testament.
