*The Will of John Lloyd of Carnarvon, Clerk, written 17 May 1814, proved 22 Feb 1815.*

In the Name of God Amen. I John Lloyd of Carnarvon in the County of Carnarvon Clerk do make publish and declare this my last Will and Testament in Writing in manner following (that is to say)

I give and devise All that my Messuage Tenement and Lands with the Appurtenances thereunto belonging situate lying and being in the Parish of Llanbeblig in the said County commonly called and known by the Name of Rhyddallt now in the Occupation of Griffith Jones unto **my Dear Wife Margaret (formerly Margaret Jones** of Bodsau? Spinster) and her Assigns for and during the term of her natural life without Impeachment of or for any manner of Waste and from and immediately after her decease I Give and Devise the same to my own Right Heirs for ever.

And as to all the Personal Estate and Effects that shall be possessed of intitled to or interested in at the time of my decease I Give and bequeath the same to my said Wife Margaret whom I hereby appoint sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me made I declare this to be my Last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto Set my Hand and Seal this Seventeenth day of May in the Year of our Lord One Thousand eight hundred and fourteen.
