Abstract of the Will of David Anwyl of Bala, Gentleman, written 19 Jan 1831, proved 7 Feb 1832.

Gives & devises two messuages or dwellinghouses in Bala, one currently occupied by Mr Williams, surgeon, and the other the late residence of his sister, along with a plot in Plas coch and a garden near the town of Bala called Caeglas Garden, to his younger children Margaret, Robert and Mary Elizabeth Anwyl, share and share alike as tenants in common rather than joint tenants.

Gives & bequeaths £2,400 among his younger children, that is:

- £600 to his daughter Margaret Anwyl
- £400 to his son Griffith Owen Anwyl
- £700 to his son Robert Anwyl
- £700 to his daughter Mary Elizabeth Anwyl

Leaves & devises the said messuages, lands and hereditaments to the use of his eldest son Rice Owen Anwyl his heirs & assigns.

Gives & leaves all his law books and manuscripts to his eldest son Rice Owen Anwyl.

All the rest of his goods, chattels and personal estate he gives & bequeaths among all his children, share and share alike.

Nominates & appoints his eldest son Rice Owen Anwyl Executor (in Trust).
