*Abstract of the Will of Jonnet Anwyl of Tynycelyn in the Parish of Llanelltyd in the County of Merioneth, spinster, written 22 Apr 1784, proved 22 Aug 1789.*

Gives & bequeaths £60 in Trust to the Reverend Rice Anwyl, Rector of Llanŷcil Cler: and the Reverend Evan Herbert, Curate of Llanfachreth, Cler:, for the purpose of applying the interest to the use and behoof of **her brother Thomas Anwyl and Catherine his wife** for the term of their natural lives. Further directs that after their deaths the said £60 shall be equally divided between **William Anwyl & Eleanor Anwyl their children—her nephew & niece respectively.**

Gives & bequeaths £5 to her aforesaid nephew William Anwyl.

Gives & bequeaths £5 to her aforesaid niece Eleanor Anwyl.

Gives & bequeaths 2 guineas to M<sup>rs</sup> Anwyl of Llanŷcil the wife of **her nephew Rice Anwyl Cler:**

Gives & bequeaths 2 guineas to **her niece Margaret Gryffyth of Plâs tainybwllch** towards buying a ring.

Gives & bequeaths to Jonett Edwards daughter of Edward Edwards of Cerrig llwydion, attorney, one mourning ring the late property of M<sup>rs</sup> Lloyd of Braich ŷ ceunant....

Gives, leaves & bequeaths all the rest & residue of her personal estate, goods & chattels to **her sister Anne Gryffyth** of Tynŷcelyn in the Parish of Llanelltyd, widow, nominating and appointing her sole executrix of her last will and testament.
