Abstract of the Will of William Anwyl of Llandeckwŷn in County of Merioneth, Clerk, Rector of Ffestiniog and Maentwrog, written 20 Jun 1729, proved 23 Oct 1730.

Confirms the settlement of his lands upon the marriage of his eldest son Thomas Lloyd Anwyl with Margaret second daughter of Thomas Meyricke of Tan y bwlch in Merioneth, Esq., by an indenture quadripartite dated 4 March 1716, made between himself and his wife Jane in the first part, Robert Nanney of Dôlgelley in Merioneth Gent. in the second part, the said Thomas Lloyd Anwil of the third part, the said Thomas Meyricke and Edward Price of Dôlgelley Esquires, and Rice Hughs of Pantperthog in the same county Gent. of the fourth part. He charges that, upon the day of his death, all his capital messuages, tenements and lands with their appurtenances called Plâs in Llandeckwŷn, with the sum of £150 towards the payment of such debts as shall be owing at the time of his death, be shared between his children in the manner following:

Gives & bequeaths £100 to his only daughter Jane Anwyl.

Gives & bequeaths £5 to his son Edward Anwyl.

Gives & bequeaths £5 to his son Lewis Anwyl.

Gives & bequeaths £5 to his son William Anwyl.

Gives & bequeaths £17 10s. to his son Robert Anwyl.

Gives & bequeaths £17 10s. to his son Owen Anwyl.

Gives & bequeaths . . . . . . . . . [document torn]

Nominates & appoints his wife Jane Anwyl to be sole executrix of his last will and testament, to whom he bequeaths & devises all the rest of his personal estate whatsoever.

Nominates & appoints Mr Rice Hughs of Pantperthog trustee and overseer of his last will and testament.
