The Will of Edmund Jones of Park, Llanfrothen, Yeoman, written 24 Dec 1833, proved 28 Jun 1834.

In the Name of God Amen I Edmund Jones of Park in the Parish of Llanfrothen and the County of Merioneth and Diocese of Bangor Yeoman, being called to mind of what is appointed to all Men even to die; And am of Sound Mind and Memory, praised by God for the same, do make, ordain, publish and declare this my last Will and Testament, in maner and form following, viz.

First, I bequeath to **my Daughter Ann Jones**, the Sum of Two Hundred Pounds, and no more.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to **my Daughter Jonet Jones** the Sum of Two Hundred Pounds, and no more.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath to **my youngest Son Richard Jones** the Sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Pounds, and no more.

Fourthly and lastly, I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint **my Dear Wife Margret Jones** and **my eldest Son John Edmund** to be Joint Executors of this my Last Will and Testament.

And finally, all the rest, residue, and remainder of All my estate and effects real and personal Whatsoever, and Wheresoever no here in before, otherwise effectually disposed of, I do give devise and bequeath unto my Dear Wife Margret and my Son John.

In Witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and Seal, this Twenty Fourth day of December one Thousand Eight hundred and Thirty Three.

Signed declared and published, as and for his Last Will and Testament in the presence of us, Who subscribed our Names as Witnesses in the Testator's presence and at his request, the Day and Year above written.
