The Will of Edward Lloyd of Cwm Bychan, written 1 Jul 1728, proved: 16 Aug 1728

This first day of July one thousand seven hundred and twenty eight I Edward Lloyd being Sick in body but of Sound and perfect mind and memory doe make this my Last Will and Testament [in] Manner following

That is to Say I comitt My Body to the earth and My Soul to God Who Gave

Imprimus: I give and bequeath to my Son Evan Lloyd twelve pounds

Item: I give and bequeath to my Son Israell Lloyd ten pounds

I give & bequeath to my Son John Lloyd twelve pounds

Item: I give & bequeath to <u>my daughter Dorothy</u> fifteen pounds besides what she had of her own

Item: I give and bequeath to my daughter Catherin Lloyd fifteen pounds

I give to my Son Richard Lloyd about a dozen & half Silver Butteris?

I leave the Clock? to Continue to the R-----

I give to my daughter Jane one Guinea

I nominate and <u>my deare Wife</u> and <u>my Son Robert</u> coe-Executors of this my Last Will and Testament In case <u>my said Son Robert</u> should happen to die within the Space of twelve years from this time that my said Wife [to home?] I appoint --?-- Executrix in Such [Case?] to Contribute & ---?-- the rest of the youngest children above mentioned out of the Share that belonged to the said Robert.

I nominate my Son Richard Lloyd to be overseere of this my Last Will & Testament.
