Street in the Town of Carnarvon, Surveyor, are held and firmly bound unto the Right Reverend Father in God Christopher Lord Bishop of Bangor in Two Hundred and Ninety Nine Pounds...

The Condition of this Obligation is such that if ... **John Edmunds the natural and lawful brother** ... Administrator of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of Jane Lloyd of Park in the parish of Llanfrothen aforesaid, Widow, deceased, do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods Chattles and Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the Hands Possession or Knowledge of him the said John Edmunds &c...

John Edmunds Owen Jones\* John Prideaux

On the 26th day of July 1848 personally appeared John Edmunds and alledged that Jane Lloyd of Olri in the parish of Llanfrothen in the County of Carnarvon [sic] Widow deceased died in the year of our Lord 1847 intestate without making any Will. That he this appearer is the lawful and natural Brother of the said deceased who died without any children. Wherefore he prays that Administration of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said deceased be granted to him on giving the usual security. Let Administration pass as prayed to the said John Edmunds he being first sworn on the Holy Evangelists as the Law directs and that the whole of the goods chattels and credits of the said deceased do not amount in value to one hundred pounds. Before me, Thos. Thomas, Surrogate. The intestate died on the 19th December 1847.
