Gives & bequeaths to **his wife Elizabeth Gwyn als.** Nanney all the sheep and cattle which are in the custody of **his son-in-law Mr Hugh Owen**; also two mares and a horse, and six steers which are in the custody of William John David Lloyd, and £1 19s. 6c. held by David Lucas.

Gives & bequeaths to his son Robert Nanney one mare.

Gives & bequeaths the said mare's colt to his grandson Edward Nanney the son of his son Robert Nanney.

Gives & bequeaths to his son Robert Nanney two bonds, one of £20 owed by **Edward's sister Mary Tannaste**, and the other held by his said son Robert.

Gives & bequeaths to his **daughter Gwen Nanney** *als*. **Owen** two cows which are in the custody of her husband Hugh Owen his son-in-law.

Gives & bequeaths 2 shillings to his daughter Anne Maddocke.

Nominates & appoints his wife Elizabeth Gwynne *als*. Nanney sole executrix of his last will and testament.
