In the Name of God Amen I Owen Owen of Hendre in the Parish of Towyn in the County of Merioneth do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say

In the first place I revoke and annul a Will made and signed by me on the twelfth day of January 1857.

I give and bequeath unto **my daughter Jane** the sum of twenty pounds sterling (£20)

I give and bequeath unto **my son Joseph** the sum of one hundred pounds sterling (£100)

I give and bequeath unto **my son Humphrey** the sum of twenty pounds sterling (£20)

I give and bequeath unto **my son William** the sum of one hundred pounds sterling (£100)

As to all the rest residue and remainder of my personal estate and effects of what kind or nature soever I give and bequeath the same to **my son Owen** and **my son Hugh** to share and share alike. I appoint my son Owen and my son Hugh to be my Executors of this my Will. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 20th day of January A.D. 1858 — Owen Owen — Signed by the said Testator Owen Owen as his last Will and Testament in the presence of us present at the same time who at his request and in his presence have subscribed our names as witnesses hereto...

Ellis R. Pring, Minister of Talyllyn John Owen, Dolydyean.

Proved at London 10th Sept. 1864 by the oath of Owen Owen the Son one of the Executors to whom Admon was granted. Power reserved of making the like grant to Hugh Owen the son also the other Executor. The Will of Owen Owen late of Hendre Aberganolwyn in the Parish of Towyn in the County of Merioneth deceased who died 20 July 1864 at Aberganolwyn aforesaid was proved 10 September at the Principal Registry by the oath of Owen Owen of Hendre aforesaid, farmer, the son, one of the Executors.
